

Boy Scout Troop 43  
Rules of Conduct

1. Each scout is expected to know and abide by these rules. Ignorance will not be considered an excuse from these rules. Common sense will prevail in all situations and interpretations of these rules.
2. Scouts will have a phone number available where their parents or a designated guardian may be reached in case of an emergency or if disciplinary action is required.
3. A scout may be sent home from any activity. Parents are expected to immediately come to the event, regardless of its location, to pick up their son and take him home.
4. Scouts will respect other people's property and not use it without permission of its owner.
5. Stealing will not be tolerated. You will be sent home immediately.
6. No running in campsite.
7. No bare feet in campsite.
8. Class "A" uniforms will be worn in accordance with Troop 43's uniform policy.
9. No open flame, in or near tents.
10. No playing with the campfires.
11. Obscene language, gestures or materials are not to be used at any troop activities.
12. No water activity will be allowed without the direct supervision of an adult leader. The activity will adhere to all BSA policies of "Safe Swim Defense" and "Safety Afloat", otherwise the scout will be sent home.
13. Malicious teasing will not be tolerated.
14. No fighting allowed. You will be sent home.
15. The "buddy system" will be used for all excursions outside of the campsite.

16. Wild animals will be left alone.
17. Vandalism will not be tolerated. You will be sent home and be financially responsible for any damages.
18. Use of alcohol or drugs (other than properly prescribed medicines) is prohibited. You will be sent home and terminated from the troop.
19. Possession of firearms or fireworks is strictly prohibited.
20. All forms of hazing, initiations, ridicule, or inappropriate teasing is not allowed.
21. A scout is expected to have a class "A" uniform (scout shirt with proper insignia, pants, belt, socks, Troop 43 neckerchief, and slide) by his scoutmaster conference for Tenderfoot or membership in the troop for 60 days. Whichever of these two events happens first?
22. Scouts are not permitted to bring any electronics devices of any kind. (Radios, electronics games, CD players, MP3 players, game boys, cellar phones, etc.)

Youth are subject to discipline for any behavior unbecoming a Boy Scout. These rules are not meant to be all inclusive. Situations will be judged on a case by case basis.

Grievances will be submitted in writing to the Troop Committee Chairman for discussion and resolution at the next regularly scheduled troop committee meeting.
